We want to take this opportunity to thank you for the support from Windsor Lifeline Outreach. Our church has been so blessed by your generosity and friendliness. We know you have helped many in the Windsor area, and have even been a blessing to those in other areas in time of crisis, but we wanted to share a few stories from our people of how they have been touched through your efforts.

In Leamington, many greenhouse owners rely heavily on migrant workers from other nations to operate their businesses. Most of these workers are here to financially support their families and scrape together every dollar they can so their children can have a better life. We have a number of these migrant workers who attend our Sunday services and most of them did not have proper clothing and outerwear for our cold winters here in Canada, especially this winter. We told the men we would help them get warm coats, but didn't know how we could do it. When we called you for help you were there as usual. You were able to provide us with enough coats, hats, gloves and boots for each of our men to have proper winter gear. They were so thankful and appreciative. One of the men said to me, "Thank you for keeping your promise to us." Another worker got a job opportunity in Alberta and after he arrived he called us and thanked us again for the warm coat and boots as it was even colder there. We thank God for you and the staff at Windsor Lifeline who helped us minister to the needs of our people.

We have also received food supplies from you on numerous occasions to help families in need in our community. This was such a blessing to them. With your help, we were able to reach out lighten the financial burden to some low income families and single moms in our congregation. And in turn, many of those we helped, came and asked if they could have some of the provisions we received from you to bless their neighbors and friends that they knew who were struggling to make ends meet.

We never know how an act of kindness can affect a person. Or how encouraging one person can change a community. We know you are making a difference by simply reaching out with compassion. You have touched lives in our church and our community and we can't thank you enough for your faithful service.
